Program of Alliances for Reconciliation **Transformative Alliances**

The six-year, \$74.9-million Program of Alliances for Reconciliation (PAR)—a joint initiative of the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) and ACDI/VOCA—formed high impact alliances with important actors in the private and public sectors, media, academia, and civil society. PAR supported national, regional and level partners to carry out initiatives that contribute to changing perceptions, attitudes, and behaviors around reconciliation, especially through promoting trust, empowerment, dialogue, and respect.




